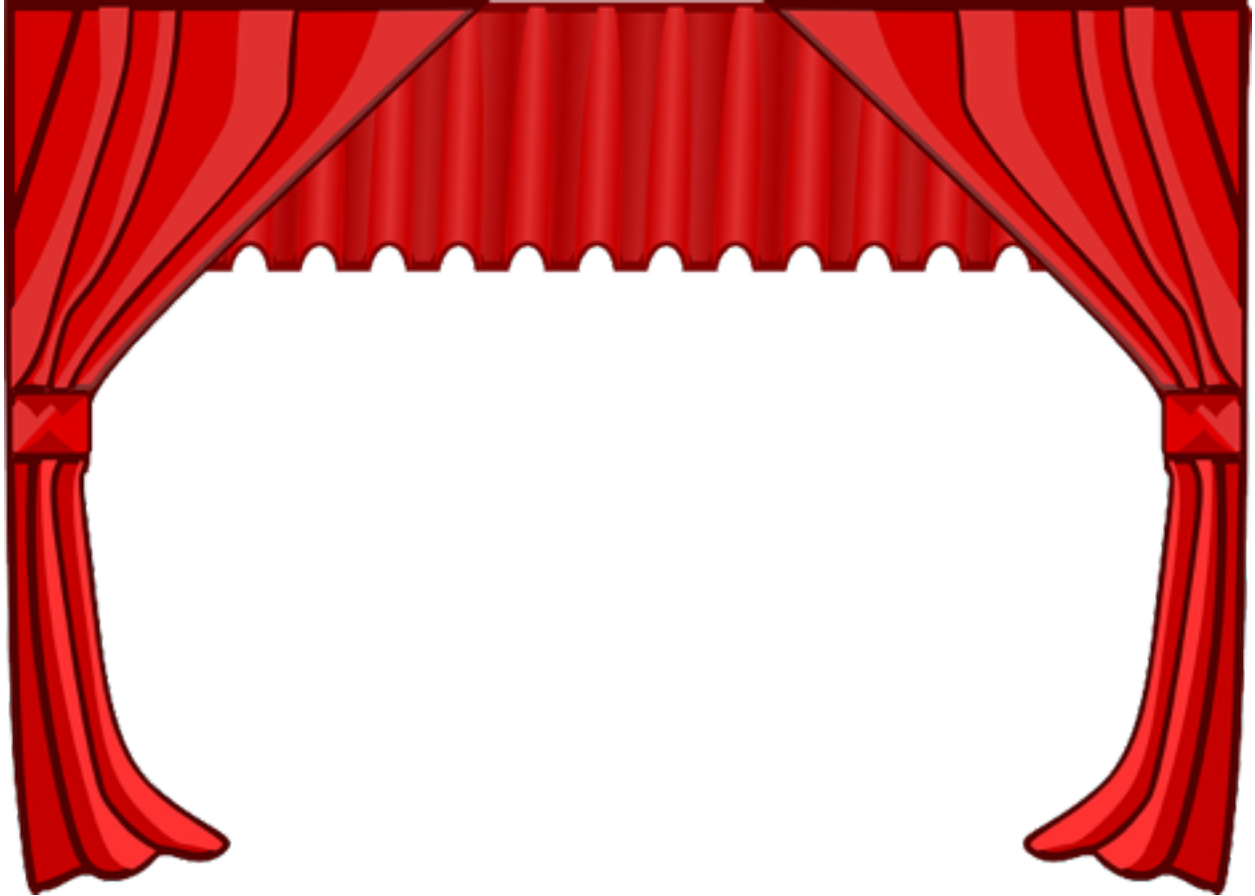


Going to the Theater!

I might get a program.



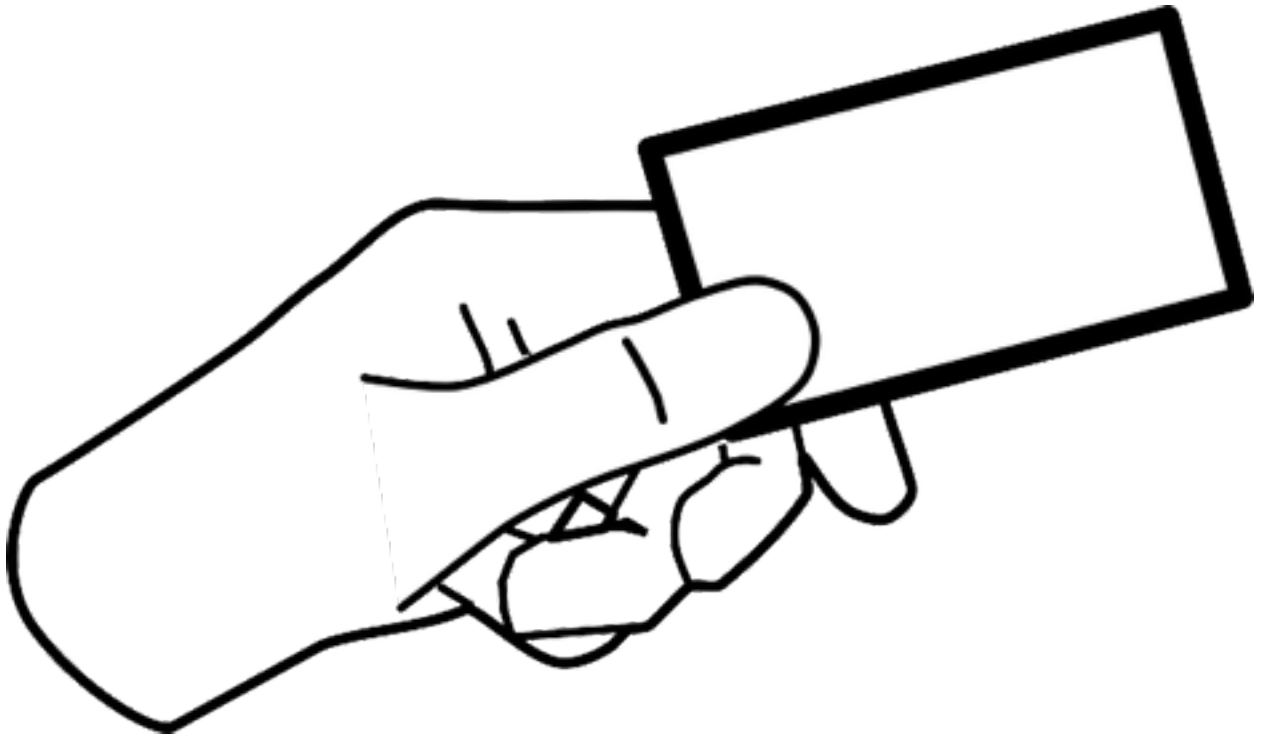
I might wait in the

costumes.



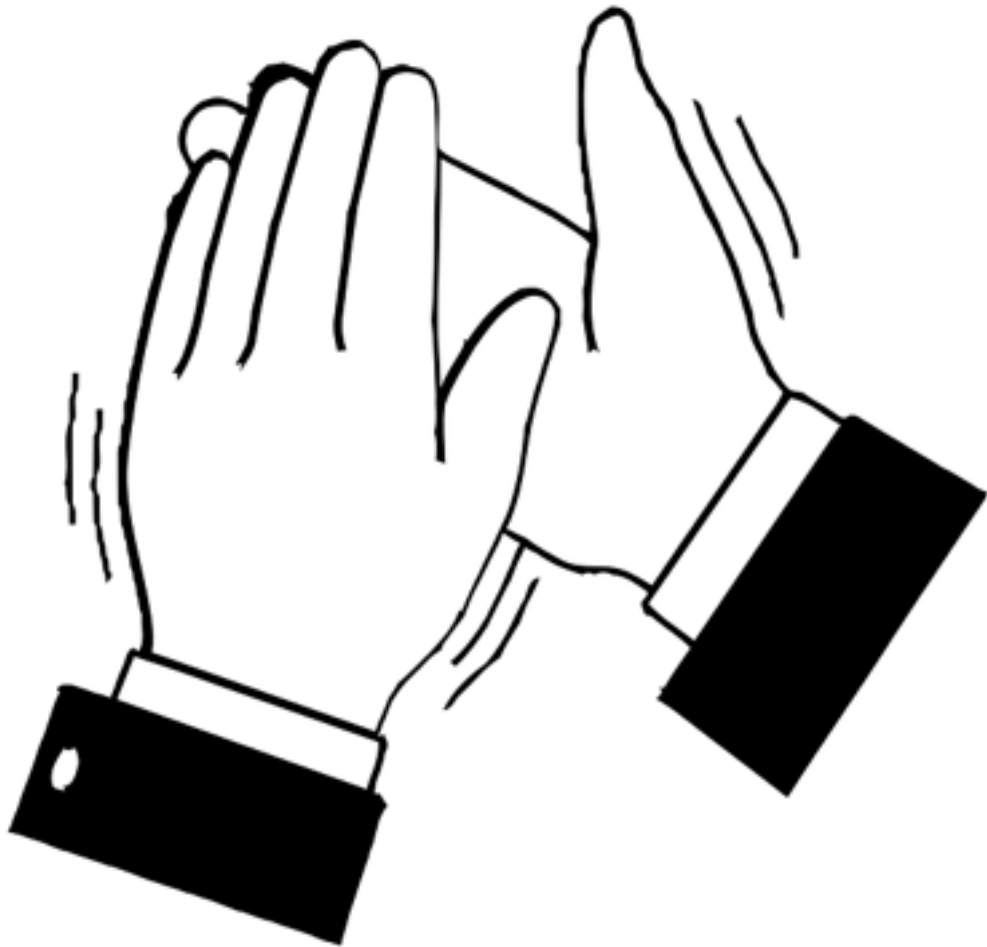
I might hear singing.
